WHAT?

We created this event to showcase ourselves in an informal setting and to help fortify our already vibrant professional network.

Latest sketches, chapters, experiences, news and ideas are shared. So is information about what is going on in our illustrator and author community.

After sharing our news we share a meal. Everyone is asked to bring something ... a beverage or salad or dessert and usually a small amount of money to help cover the cost of dinner.

WHO?

Both professionals and non-published members are encouraged to participate regularly. Participating might just mean listening at times.

No one is expected to attend every time so each evening has a new ambiance. It is what you make of it so help make it great.

Out-of-town guests are welcomed. Non-members are also welcome on a one-time basis.

All members can host an event. The space chosen should be relatively quiet and provide room for a group of 10-25 people.

WHEN:

Show & Tell evenings happen at least every other month, usually on a **Thursday** night from **7:30-10 pm** from September to June.

WHERE?

Email announcements are sent to members and friends in advance with the date, time and the host's contact information.

Addresses and door codes are shared upon RSVP (and not online for security reasons).

HOW?

If you do not plan on attending, there is no need to RSVP. Otherwise, let the host or hostess know. (A last minute RSVP is truly okay.)
