### SUBMISSION GUIDELINES:

#### PLEASE NOTE: WE CAN ONLY ACCEPT STORIES MEETING THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES

- 1) <u>WHO</u>: All young authors, from Kindergarten/*Grande Section* to Grade 12/*Terminale,* who write in English and who live in Paris and the vicinity.
- 2) WHAT: ONE original story per student written after September 1, 2009. All stories must:
  - Have a clear beginning, middle, and end;
  - · Respect the following word limit,
  - 750 words for grades K-5/GS-CM2 1000 words for grades 6-12/college-lycée Note: longer pieces will not be accepted
  - Be typed, using Times New Roman or Arial fonts, 12 point, double-spaced, with one-inch (2.5 cm) margins No handwritten work, illustrations or color print, please.

#### See the sample story format (page 3) for formatting examples.

- 3) WHEN: The deadline for story submissions is 1 April 2010 at midnight. No late submissions will be accepted.
- 4) WHERE: Submit your stories only by e-mail to: yaff2010@gmail.com
- 5) **HOW:** Please follow these three simple steps:
  - In the SUBJECT line of your email, write: Last Name, First Name, grade/class. Example: Subject: Smith, Jane, 3rd Grade/CM1.
  - 2) In the BODY of your email, COPY and PASTE the COVER PAGE (see page 2 of these guidelines) and fill it in. *We cannot accept any stories without this information.*
  - 3) ATTACH your story to the e-mail as a WORD.doc file. Use the story title ONLY as the document name.

IMPORTANT! PLEASE READ! IMPORTANT! PLEASE READ!
DO NOT include your name anywhere in the story attachment,
not in the story text OR in the document name.
Your document name should be your story TITLE only.
We must receive an anonymous copy in order to accept it.
When we receive your story submission, we will send you an e-mail confirmation.
If you do not receive it within 48 hours, we may not have received your story, so please let us know.

- 6) Do not use obscene language the winning stories will be published and read by people of all ages.
- 7) Join us for the Young Authors' Fiction Festival Celebration on Friday 4 June 2010 at the International School of Paris, 13 rue Beethoven, 16eme. Enjoy the world of and books, books, books. Meet published authors and get your books signed. The top five stories and Honorable Mentions from each grade/class will be announced. *Finalists will be notified two weeks in advance so they'll be sure to know to come*. But we strongly encourage all participating authors to attend!

ATTACH your story to the message as a Word.doc file with the TITLE of your story as the file name. DO NOT TYPE your name anywhere on the story. We MUST RECEIVE an anonymous copy of your story.

SAMPLE: STORY TITLE Center the SAME title you put on the cover sheet and type it here.

### REMEMBER: DO NOT TYPE YOUR NAME or CONTACT INFORMATION IN YOUR STORY!

**Tab in once** from the left of your page and then start typing your story. Tab in (indent) at the start of each new paragraph. Use TIMES NEW ROMAN or Arial as the font for your story. Be sure to **double-space** your story so it is easy to read. Be careful with spelling and punctuation! Use one-inch margins (2.5 cm) on the left-hand and right-hand sides of the page, and one-inch margins (2.5 cm) on the top and bottom too.

Be sure to include the PAGE NUMBERS and the TITLE of your story at the TOP of EACH PAGE, as you can see above. If your story is too long, it cannot be accepted for the contest. Check the maximum amount of words allowed for your grade level on the main page of the GUIDELINES.

Include a beginning, middle and end to your story. Be creative! Be true to your own voice, and above all, HAVE FUN! If you are still unsure how to format your story, please go to <a href="http://www.scbwi.org/pubs.htm">www.scbwi.org/pubs.htm</a> and click on *SCBWI Publications*. Then click on *From Keyboard to Printed Page: Facts You Need to Know*. There, you'll find everything you need to know about formatting your story and manuscript.

The best writers are happy readers, so read a ton of books and write, write, write. That's what writers do: they write. Use your imagination. It's the greatest! And remember your spelling and you'll do swell!
